39 ACTIONS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING
OF THE FORUM IF NOT ALREADY ON THE AGENDA

40 PRESENTATION OF THE VERGE BIOMASS PROJECT (MINUTE 21)

The Chairman gave a brief explanation of the project for those members who had not attended the presentation adding that the project involved collaboration between the County Council and the Wildlife Trust to use surplus grass cuttings from verges for biomass. The Chairman stated that he had volunteered to represent the Forum on the Working Group and had attended the first meeting of the Group at which technical issues had been discussed.

The Chairman stated that the issues raised by the Environment Agency at the last meeting had now been resolved.

Comments by members included:-

- Could a wider cut of the verges be made which would improve conditions for horse riders and walkers? The Chairman stated that this was a pilot project and if it proved successful then there would be an opportunity to expand the project in the Wolds and he had raised the advantages of expanding the cut at the Working Group.
- Concerns had been expressed by the Wildlife Trust about the effects of the cutting of the verges during the bird nesting season and the Chairman agreed stating that cuts were subject to the approval of the Wildlife Trust.
- Where were the Anaerobic Digesters (Ads) located? The ADs were located in the Spilsby area which had three. It was hoped to encourage the growth of wild flowers which had been depleted in recent years due to the loss of meadow land.
- It would be a huge undertaking to cut all of the verges in Lincolnshire and some verges were cut by owners which were welcomed by the Working Group.
- Many verges were not suitable for cutting as they had potholes and ruts.
- Because of the summer drought last year there was a shortage of silage this winter.

41 UPDATE ON THE REORGANISATION OF LOCAL ACCESS FORUMS
FOR LINCOLNSHIRE

The Chairman reminded members of the current on-going discussions to create one Local Access Forum (LAF) for Lincolnshire excluding Rutland County Council and that once it had been agreed to have one Forum then it would be necessary to appoint new members.

Comments by members included:-

- Why was Rutland being excluded? Officers stated that the majority of members on the South Lincolnshire and Rutland LAF were from Rutland and many items on the agenda were for Rutland.
- Having one LAF for Lincolnshire which was geographically very large would create, amongst other issues, logistical issues for travel to meetings. Officers stated that it was hoped to arrange meetings in a central part of Lincolnshire and to make more use of maps and photographs at meetings.
- It was hoped that the new LAF would comprise more volunteers than representatives from local authorities.
- The role of the LAF needed to be publicised to attract more representatives.

The Forum received a report from North East Lincolnshire Council in connection with the latest situation of their Public Path Orders.

Officers stated that with regard to footpath 72 (Waltham) an application to relocate a sub-station had been received by the Council from Babcock International which was controversial.

Officers stated that an Extinguishment Order was being used in connection with the diversion of footpath 90 (Ashby cum Fenby) and was currently being consulted upon.

47 REPORTS OF LINCOLNSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL48 DEFINITIVE MAP MODIFICATION ORDERS

The Forum received a report from Lincolnshire County Council in connection with the latest position of their Definitive Map Orders.

Officers stated that since the publication of report the Public Footpath at School Lane to Dogdyke Road, Coningsby had been confirmed in part. The Public Footpath from Caistor Road to Gatehouse Lane, Middle Rasen had gone to the Planning Inspectorate and it was hoped that any issues could be dealt with by written representations and that the claimed bridleway from Common Lane to Cow Lane, Heapham had been submitted to the Secretary of State to determine.

Comments by members included:-

- There was pressure on the County Council in connection with the footpath at Middle Rasen (Caistor Road to Gatehouse Lane) as there was soon to be development which would affect the route of the footpath.
- A member stated that he had attended West Lindsey District Council's Planning Committee when this planning application had been considered and had spoken against the application and could not understand why this footpath had not been taken into account in the Local Plan.
- A member stated that he had submitted written comments against the application and had also spoken to Chestnut Homes about the issues.
- A similar problem had occurred at Tetney where a footpath had been illegally blocked. Officers agreed to ask Jonathan Stockdale, Senior Highways Officer for this area, to examine this problem. Officers stated that the public needed to report such incidents to the County Council.
- It was suggested that the Parish Council should be asked to send a letter to the person blocking the footpath.
- Officers explained the process for the removal of an obstruction from a footpath.

RESOLVED

That the report be noted and that Jonathan Stockdale be requested to contact Sandra Harrison in connection with the blocked footpath at Tetney.

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COUNTRYSIDE FOR ALL – Report

1. COUNTRYSIDE FOR ALL ROUTES

1.1. Lincolnshire

We have agreed with DPS Digital that they will undertake the outstanding work Printtalk quoted for. This will include the Gibraltar Point leaflet. Work is continuing to prepare the drafts for DPS Digital.

We have discussed the possibility of getting Lottery funding to produce the leaflets which are sent out to libraries and tourist information centres annually. We will be working on this once the 7 new route leaflets are printed.

1.2. Rutland

The Rutland route leaflet folders funding, was initially going to be with the Choice Unlimited 2019 grant funding application but we are now going to apply for Lottery funding for this. Further information on this is in item 4

2. DEMENTIA FRIENDLY WALKS – RUTLAND

The training took place on the 6th February 2019. Active Rutland will be aiming to deliver the first walk in May through the newly trained volunteers.

3. CHOICE UNLIMITED EVENT - RUTLAND

The Lottery agreed that we could divert the 2018 funds originally destined for the LAF to the Choice Unlimited event. This enabled the Choice Unlimited Working Group to pay for the 2019 venue in 2018. It has also meant we used VAR rooms as meeting rooms rather than struggling for space in offices, paid for the design of the flyer for the event, as well as a roller banner and outdoor feather flag.

Irwin Mitchell provided the printing of 3000 leaflets for free. They have also agreed to print the programmes for free.

Unfortunately we will not be able to apply to the Lottery through RCC for future Choice Unlimited events. The Choice Unlimited Working Group has discussed the situation with Rutland Access Group (RAG). RAG has kindly agreed to take this on. A member of the Choice Unlimited Working Group, also a member of the LAF has agreed to join RAG and lead on the Choice Unlimited events.

Thanks to Gary Crellin of the Rutland Showground and the kind owner of the marquee for the Mistletoe Fair, we are being allowed to use this marquee for free at the event. The Mistletoe fair is at the Showground from the 26th to the 28th of October. Our event is on the 23rd of October. The organiser is going to erect the marquee earlier to enable us to use this. The marquee is 30mts by 12mts. The one

we were hoping to hire was 27mts by 12mts, so this is fantastic news. The price we would have had to pay for the marquee was £4439.

We have secured a minimum of £2000 from the Tesco Bags of Help fund. The community voting is still in progress. We hope to win another £6000, this will enable us to book the Rutland Showground this year for 2020. As an insurance, if we do not win further funding from Tesco, RAG will be applying for Lottery funding.

After spending a day at NAIDEX, which is the annual event for Independent living at the NEC, we have managed to encourage a number of exhibitors from there to Exhibit at Choice Unlimited.

4. RUTLAND'S LOTTERY APPLICATION

We are obtaining information to apply for a grant which will enable us to fund:

- Folders for the Countryside For All route leaflets

- Create 4 route leaflets which will be headed miles without stiles

- A roll up banner and event table cloths for C4A exhibitions etc.

- Assisting in design of a logo

Plus some additional small items e.g. funding for table space at the 2020 Choice Unlimited events.

Summary:

A report on the progress of Definitive Map Modification Order Currently being undertaken.

Recommendation(s):

That the report is noted & formal written advice provided as required.

1. Background

As Surveying Authority the County Council has a statutory duty to keep under continuous review the Definitive Rights of Way Map and Statement for Lincolnshire and to make orders to take account of events requiring the map to be modified. This is carried out by the processing of Definitive Map Modification Orders (DMMOs) which are either applied for by the public or initiated by the Authority on the discovery of evidence.

Highways & Traffic Guidance Note HAT33/3/11 sets out that such cases will be dealt with in order of receipt/initiation unless one or more of the eight "exception criteria" apply.

The criteria are as follows:

1. Where there is sustained aggression, hostility and ill feeling within a community that is causing severe disruption to the life of that community, and that in processing the case early there is a strong likelihood that this will reduce.
2. Where there is a significant threat to the route, likely to cause a permanent obstruction (e.g. a building, but not, for example, a locked gate or residential fencing).
3. Where there is, or has been, a finding of maladministration by the Local Government Ombudsman on a particular case and that in processing the case the County Council will discharge its duty to the Ombudsman's decision.

4. Where legal proceedings against the County Council are instigated or are likely to be instigated and it is possible that the Authority has a liability.
5. Where there is a risk to children on County Council owned property and land or where the claimed route would provide for a safer alternative route to a school, play area or other amenity for children.
6. Where there is a significant financial saving to the County Council (and therefore taxpayers) through the processing of an Order.
7. Where a new application is received that relies on evidence of a case already received or, if the new application forms part of or is adjoining to an existing claim, the new claim will be dealt with at the same time as the older application.
8. Where the route will significantly assist in achieving a Countryside and Rights of Way Improvement Plan Objective or Statement of Action.

The above numbered exception criteria do not cover every eventuality and it is recognised that in exceptional circumstances there may be other reasons why it would benefit the public for a case to be considered out of normal order. Officers will not prioritise any case under such circumstances and any appeal will only be considered by the Definitive Map & Statement of Public Rights of Way Sub-Committee.

Initially the priority of a case is set by Officers however there is a right of appeal for any affected persons whereby a decision is made by the Definitive Map & Statement of Public Rights of Way Sub-Committee.
