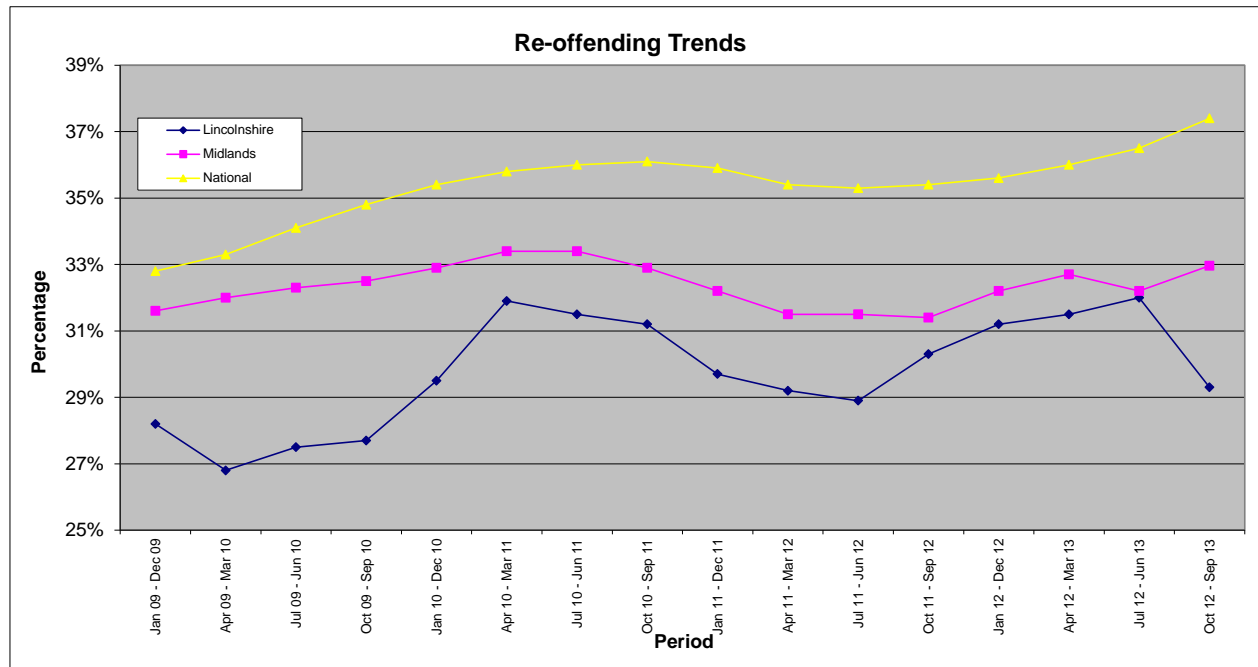


# Lincolnshire Youth Offending - Re-offending Rate

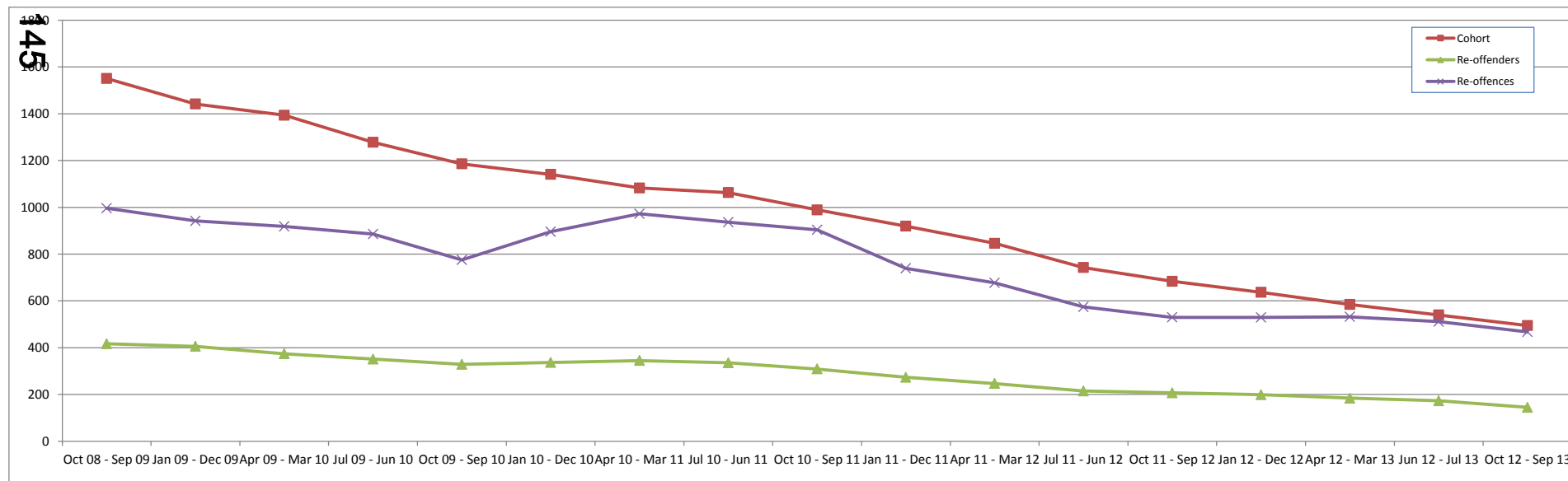

Note: this is a binary figure based on a 12 months offending cohort tracked over the following 12 months.

Having a smaller cohort year on year, leaves the Service with a higher proportion of young people whom we would consider in the past a Persistent Young Offender (PYO). This group is harder to engage and presents more of a challenge in getting them to stop offending. Consequently, the re-offending rate has risen. However, we are currently engaging in a project to analyse this group and help identify those factors that lead them to go on to re-offend.

The graph below shows clearly the trend in actual young offenders/offences over the same period.
