Potential Contents of a Formal Response from the Executive to the Sustainability and Transformation Plan (in no particular order)

- The changes proposed within the STP are expected to deliver substantial savings to the local NHS economy over 4 years. How confident are local NHS Leaders that such savings can be delivered and, what will happen if these are not achieved.
- 2. How is removing any of the services identified within the STP going to make things better <u>for everyone</u> who has to use it.
- 3. What are the plans to secure the expected capital investment should the application to NHSE not be successful or partially successful.
- What account has been taken of the effect on the changes proposed within local NHS services to any additional burden to be faced by social care services.
- 5. There are 7 NHS organisations in Lincolnshire (4 Commissioners, 3 Providers) and many of these are relatively small in the context of NHS local organisations. What plans do NHS leaders have for a reduction in overheads associated with so many organisations serving a population of less than 750,000.
- 6. Noting the very real pressures on Primary Care how will the envisaged shift from acute to primary as envisaged in the STP be resourced and, what is the Local Medical Committees views concerning the STP.
- 7. How will the NHS ensure that any proposed changes are truly 'safe' for the patients and their families affected.
- 8. We are aware that 'safe' may be interpreted as 'clinically safe' but we would also like to be reassured that any changes envisaged do not unduly affect our shared responsibilities towards Safeguarding Adults as detailed in the Care Act 2014. How will NHS colleagues ensure Safeguarding Adults remains a priority and is not negatively impacted by changes detailed within the STP.
- 9. Additional investment in mental health services are a national requirement, how will NHS Leaders ensure this point is honoured.
- 10. Will STP proposals change in light of public consultation.
- 11. The Five Year Forward View prioritises prevention as a critical determinant in creating a financially sustainable platform. What plans are in place to generate additional Preventative measures when nationally the Public Sector ring-fenced grant is being shrunk to the end of the decade.
- 12. The rural and dispersed nature of Lincolnshire's geography and the diverse nature of the population can create particular challenges for the public in accessing and making use of public services and these challenges can be

disproportionately greater for people with a protected characteristic. What steps have you taken to ensure that you understand these impacts and how have they been taken into account in the final form of the STP?
