

## What's new in JMWMS Revised Draft (version 4.1)

This document accompanies the completed Revised Draft (also known as version 4.1) of the JMWMS, and summarises the changes which have been made to the Consultation Draft (version 3.3) as a result of feedback received.

Section	Change
Throughout	Various wording tweaks to improve format and readability.
Cover – Title	Shortened to "Waste Strategy for Lincolnshire". Alternative suggestions have included: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Tackling Waste Together</li> <li>• Cleaner Today, Greener Tomorrow</li> </ul>
Cover – Images	Will now show small version of LWP logo (not each individual partner logos) with suitable photos which are yet to be selected.
Foreword	This will be added by Chair and Vice Chair on behalf of LWP.
1 – Summary (and sub-sections)	Vision moved to the beginning to emphasise it more. Various changes to reflect that this is no longer the Consultation Version. Some queries raised about summary sections are clarified in the corresponding full chapter.
1.2 – Document layout	Emphasises that the Action Plan is now included in the appendices as this was raised a lot in the Consultation process.
1.3 – Where are we	Added reference to challenges of higher recycling targets & volatile recycling markets.
1.4 – Objectives	Some Objectives strengthened in line with views expressed in Consultation. Further explanation of the reasoning behind each Objective, and any strengthening, have been added to the matching list in Section 6.1.
2.1 – Background	Clarification (further to a partner question) that the WET Act requirement to have a JMWMS specifies WDA & WCA only, so only they need to formally adopt it. NB – As an LWP partner, the EA's views on the JMWMS have been sought through the Consultation process.
2.2.1 – Waste Hierarchy	Text added to refer to expanded Objective 4.
3.1 – EU Policy	Updated to reflect adoption of Circular Economy Package, including new recycling targets and biowaste collections.
3.1.1 – Waste Hierarchy	Largely deleted and replaced with cross-reference to similar Section 2.2.1.
3.1.3 – Separate collections	Added reference to new CEP requirement for biowaste collections, whilst noting that we await Defra's new strategy for clarification of what this means for the UK.
3.2 – National Policy	Referred to need for flexibility including annual review of Action Plan.
3.2.3 – Planning Policy	Minor tweaks, particularly to refer to recent update to National Planning Policy Framework.
3.3 – Waste Local Plan	
3.4 – Neighbouring authorities	Unfortunately, we received limited consultation responses from neighbours, despite emailing them directly. The revised text was suggested by an LWP partner. We will need to consider neighbours and opportunities for joint working in taking forwards individual projects and workstreams.
4.4.1 – LWP Involvement	Clarification of how LWP partners have been involved in developing the JMWMS.
4.4.2 – Public Consultation	Reflects that Consultation has now happened, and refers to results in Appendix B.
5 – Today (Throughout chapter)	Various updates to data tables, largely reflecting the availability of 2017/18 tonnages. Where this has required text changes, this is referred to by section below.
5 – Today (Intro)	Reference to "firmly planned" changes was queried. Text now clarifies that this is part of a longer quote from Defra's JMWMS Practice Guide.
5.1 – Demographics	Text reflects new population estimates and, in particular, a higher growth rate for NKDC.
5.2.1 – UK Arisings	Text reflects updated national data from Defra, though still only from 2014.

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5.2.3 – Waste Growth	2017/18 shows a fall in total waste compared to 2016/17, largely due to green waste (and weather), so text seeks to explain that the overall trend still appears to be upwards.
5.3.1 – MDR	Contamination level has increased further.
5.3.2 – Kerbside residual	Added definition of 2 largest waste types as they were felt to be unclear.
5.4.1 – Collections	Tweaks to text on end of life vehicles, flytipping & clinical waste
5.4.1 – Table 5.10	Details given for new (April 2018) Boston HWRC
5.4.2 – Table 5.12	For clarify stated that: "Mattresses are often delivered in in loads of mixed residual waste. This is the weight of mattresses which were delivered (and weighed) separately."
5.4.2 – Table 5.13	To be revised in Final JMWMS if new 2017/18 info is available, but this shouldn't change significantly.
5.4.3 – Table 5.14	List of composting sites updated.
5.4.3 – Recycling & Composting	Replaced info on "6-mix" with info on current "no thanks" campaign, including image to be used on bin sticker.
5.4.4 – Residual waste	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Table reflects FCC's current plans for each landfill site.</li> <li>Although "zero to landfill" had been queried, that seems to be in line with Objective 4 on the Waste Hierarchy.</li> </ul>
5.5.2 – Recycling performance	Unfortunately 2017/18 saw a further fall in our recycling rate. The added text goes some way to explaining this, including the fall in green waste composting and the impact of the "Beast from the East" on early Spring growing conditions.
5.5.4 – Capture rate	Recycling of some materials has fallen. Added an explanation of colour-coding in Table 5-20.
5.6 – Table 5-21	To be revised in Final JMWMS if new (2017/18?) service costs info is available.
6.1 – Objectives	Added text to introduction in response to Consultation responses.
6.1 – Objectives	Whilst, in essence, the Objectives remain the same, there are various edits in response to Consultation feedback, largely to strengthen them. Each Objective is now accompanied by text to describe both the thinking behind it and the reasoning for any revision of it.
6.2.1 – Falling recycling	Additional text to reflect increasing contamination of MDR and possible reasons behind it.
6.2.2 – National/international	New text to reflect new Defra data and to emphasise differences in Wales.
6.2.3 – Arisings growth	There is a possibility of a small further increase in throughput at the EfW, so the text now says it is " <b>close to</b> full capacity".
7 – Forward Plan	Amendments reflect the inclusion of an in-chapter summary of the Action Plan workstreams plus the initial Action Plan in full as Appendix D.
7.2.3 – VfM/Env Balance	In light of multiple Consultation responses regarding this, a short paragraph has been added including wording suggested at the July 2018 LWP meeting: "the best environmental option which can be afforded"
7.3 – What we collect	Added the need to consider impact of new collections on rounds and vehicles.
7.5 – Action Plan	Added a summary of each workstream included in the Action Plan – Appendix D. Most of the text describing each workstream is copied directly from the scoping documents which were presented to the Chief Executives Group.
8.1 – Monitoring	In line with Consultation responses, added a commitment to regular performance reporting to the LWP.
8.3 – Review	Strengthened commitment for LWP to review JMWMS in 5 years and for regular review of Action Plan.
Appendix A – Vision & Objectives (Was AppxB in Consultation)	Shortened (from previous AppxB) to now only cover the July 2017 workshops and their output. Other items are now covered elsewhere.
Appendix B – Consultation (Was AppxC in Consultation)	Previous AppxC was a placeholder. This version was presented to LWP in July, but has been updated with final Consultation responses.
Appendix C – Neighbours (Was AppxA in Consultation)	Summarises consultation responses from neighbouring councils.

Appendix D – Action Plan (New)	Added in line with LWP feedback and Consultation responses.
Appendix E – Glossary (Was AppxD in Consultation)	Inserted definition of Recycling Credits. Full Environmental Protection Act definition is too complex, so this is a paraphrasing.

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
