## **Summary**

All comments are positive, including those relating to schools in categories – for example, the Bluecoat School in Stamford (p.2) is judged to require improvement but provision for SMSC is 'a strength'. Likewise, Moulton Chapel (p.6) is also judged to require improvement but SMSC is 'a real strength of the school.' In this sample of schools there are more references than usual to pupils' spiritual development, opportunities for reflection and the contribution of assemblies.
