Summary:

1. Background

The Schools White Paper "The Importance of Teaching" was published by the Department for Education on 24 November 2010 and is attached at Appendix A.

The Schools White Paper sets out a radical reform programme for the schools system. Drawing heavily on evidence from the world's best education systems, it outlines how the Government will raise the prestige of the teaching profession and also sets out:-

- powers for teachers to improve discipline, and trialling a new approach to exclusions
- a vision for a transformed school curriculum supported by rigorous assessment and qualifications
- more academies and free schools and a strong strategic role for local authorities
- changes to school performance tables, Ofsted inspections and governance
- a fairer funding system including a pupil premium to channel more money to the most deprived children
- school-led school improvement replacing top-down initiatives.

Debbie Barnes and Andy Breckon, Assistant Directors for Children's Services, will provide a verbal summary of the key issues in the Schools White Paper and its implications for Children's Services.
