This includes identifying and prioritising relevant families from data lists, authorisation of information sharing agreements, confirmation of contributions of resources in kind and agreeing the governance of the project. In addition, work has begun with HR regarding the structure of the operational team; and discussions have advanced with senior management to evaluate the financial sustainability of the project over the three-year project.

Small Schools Collaboration	•		As a result of proposed DfE changes to school funding a major review of the project has had to take place. As the LA will not be allowed to target type or size of school with funding in the new financial year the project will rely on schools agreeing to use their own budgets to collaborate. The majority of conditions linked to funding have now been removed. The role of the LA after this year will be to support and advice schools who wish to be part of a collaboration. It will mean that there will be no financial liabilities for the LA after this financial year but it will be necessary for the funding agreement with schools to be fundamentally reviewed. Business plans and Heads of Agreements continue to be submitted by groups of schools and funding has been released to a small number of the partnerships.
			Scrutiny: The Committee considered two reports on this project at its meetings on 3 February 2012 and 20 July 2012. The Committee strongly supported the proposed project. The proposals for this project were also discussed as part of the reports received at the meetings on 7 September 2012 and 19 October 2012 on School Funding Arrangements for 2013/14. The Committee expressed its disappointment that the project would no longer be able to go ahead.
Youth and Community Development			The project continues to make good progress. The first youth centre to have reached the stage of final sign off is Gainsborough and the Project Team is currently awaiting comments from Legal Services and Finance regarding the final arrangements prior to the lease being drawn up.
			Scrutiny: The Committee considered two reports on this project at its meetings on 20 April 2012 and 19 October 2012. The Committee were satisfied with the progress being made with the project and requested that the next update sets out what is happening to the youth workers employed at the youth centres, how many young people are engaged and how many activities are taking place.
