

• Future consultation will take place at a stage when there is scope to influence the plan and/or outcome.

- Consultations will normally last between at least 6 to 12 weeks with consideration given to longer timescales where feasible and sensible to do so (for example the CYPP).
- Consultation documents will be clear about the consultation process, what is being proposed, the scope to influence and benefits of the proposals (including financial where possible).
- Consultation exercises will be designed to be accessible to, and clearly targeted at, those people the exercise is intended to reach across the CYPSP.
- Keeping the burden of consultation to a minimum is essential if consultations are to be effective and if consultees' buy-in to the process is to be obtained.
- Consultation responses will be analysed and feedback will be provided to the Children's Trust Board.
- The Children's Trust Board will share what they have learned from the consultation experience with the findings/results and a summary being posted on the Lincolnshirechildren.net web site
