Over the last three years there has been a concerted effort by many schools to cut their energy use, reduce their bills and shrink their carbon footprint. An East Midlands-wide SCoRE project (Schools Collaboration on Resource Efficiency), supported by local authorities and the Carbon Trust, has worked with 80 pilot schools. Reductions of up to 27% were achieved through no-cost and low-cost measures alone, showing that energy saving isn't all about technology, but is very much about people and how we use our buildings.

Investment in technologies and the buildings themselves also have their place and the conference will feature a wide range of case study examples. These will include new lighting, boiler improvements and renewables alongside examples of low cost measures. Join colleagues from pioneering schools from across the East Midlands to learn what works in practice.

Yours can be a low carbon school too!
