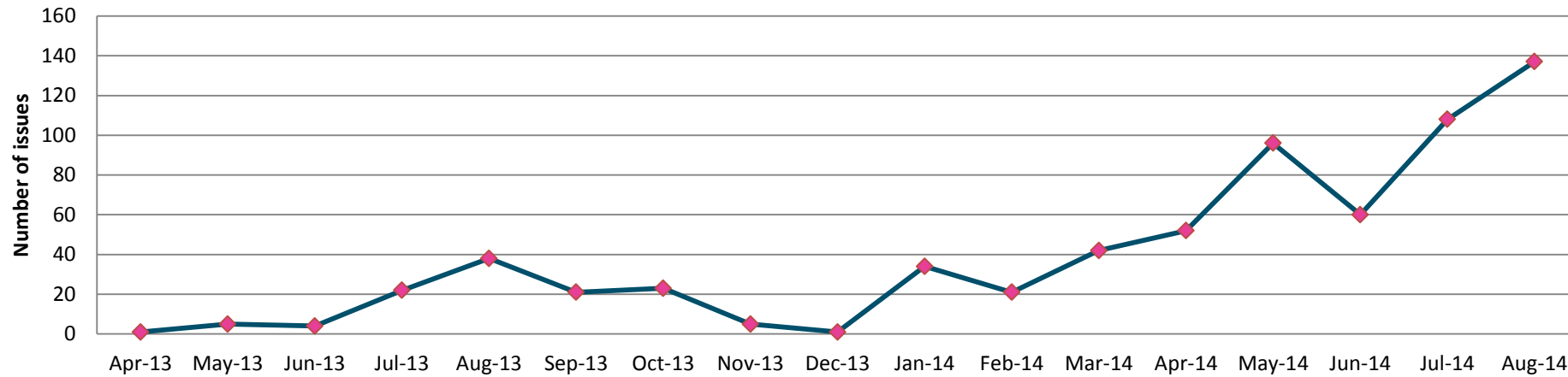

Current research work

- **GP – Did Not Attend:**

- 38 GP Surgeries responded, from even geographical and demographic spread across Lincolnshire
- 428 patients responded, from even geographical and demographic spread across Lincolnshire
- 60% of practices have text message appointment reminders and 75% had email appointment reminders
- 80% of practices have online booking appointment systems in place
- 33% of patients who failed to attend 'forgot'

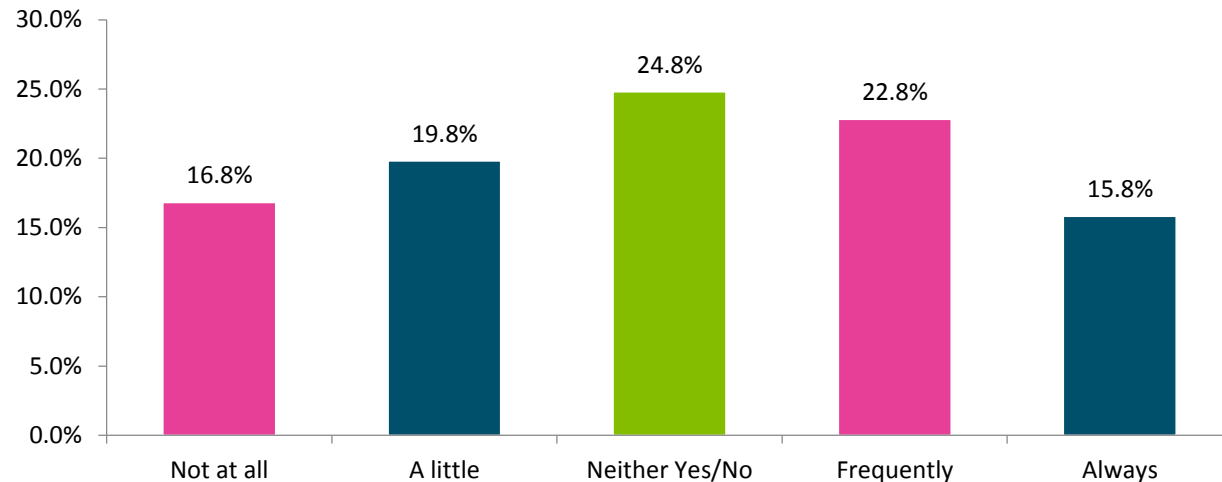
- Average number of missed appointments in Lincolnshire at GP practice is 184,224
- Average cost of missed appointments in Lincolnshire is £6.6m
- ? If this is the cost for GP appointments what might be the cost to other health and care services

Pharmacy

- Supporting a request from Pharmacy LPN as part of a national consultation exercise looking into the use of pharmacies
- 101 patients completed a complex survey
- Complement the Lincolnshire Pharmaceutical Needs Assessment

Young People

- Request as part of the CQC Looked After Children's Inspection Dec 2013
- 1,314 young people between the ages of 11-18 (small number up to 25)
- Key issues:
 - Self-harm – 20.5% of young people admitted to self harming with bullying, problems with school or family and depression being the main reasons
 - Bullying – half of the respondents had been bullied
 - Young carer – 16.5% identified themselves as a young carer
 - Drug use – 74% of young people are satisfied with the services available to help them stop using illegal drugs.
 - Smoking – 23% of respondents smoke or have tried smoking
 - Alcohol – 52.1% of 11 to 15 year olds have consumed alcohol of these 10.6% drink at home alone

Mental health

- Survey currently open, closes 7th November 2014
- Asking current service users what are their personal views of mental health services – medical and support
- Asking patients waiting for assessments/treatments how long they have been waiting
- Aligning this with Public Health Mental Health Needs Analysis and Mental Health Strategy
