I would like to apologise on behalf of any parent who has been at all rude towards the residents of Cardyke Drive when being asked to move his/her vehicle.

We actively encourage all of our Baston-based families to walk or cycle to school. However, we also have a significant number of pupils living outside of the village who have no alternative but to come to school by car.

As far as I am aware the school considered setting up a walking bus scheme around three years ago. Clearly such a scheme would rely heavily upon volunteers from within the community and volunteers for the scheme would have to be DBS cleared. Unfortunately there was insufficient support to establish such a scheme. I am happy to contact parents to find out how many families would make use of a walking bus and how many parents might be able to volunteer to run it.

When considering your point regarding parental dropping off inside the school grounds, it is essential to remember that, in case of an outbreak of fire at the school, the only available access for a fire engine is down the school's drive. After this the engine would have to turn around the turning circle and pass through the very tight left turn into the school's car park. From here the fire engine can pass through a set of gates to gain access on to the school field from where the fire would be tackled. As I am sure you will appreciate, on grounds of safety, it is not possible for us to allow parents to bring vehicles on to the school grounds during drop-off and pick-up would be a potentially fatal hazard. The school has previously made contact with Lincolnshire Police with a view to borrowing a Speed Indication Device to set up outside the school. We have also requested the occasional presence of a PCSO. Unfortunately, the constabulary were unable to commit to either of these measures. We would fully support the Parish Council in making a fresh request - or perhaps this is something that we could do together.

I am open to finding a solution for this issue and I hope that we continue to work closely together to ensure all members of the community feel valued while keeping our children safe.

Thank you for your letter dated 19 November 2014 in connection with the above.

I have discussed this matter with colleagues in Children's Services who have spoken directly with the Head at the school.

The school have been reminded that the planning permission granted in 1992 included a requirement that the development is undertaken in accordance with the approved plans which makes provision for parent parking. Therefore the school gate should remain open at school starting and finishing times for parents to access this parking should they wish to do so.

As you will no doubt appreciate the school cannot force the parents to use this on-site parking but must ensure that it remains available at the start and finish of the school day.

If the school are concerned about the ability of a fire engine to access the school with the permission for an alternative parking layout removing parents parking with a justification for this.

The school may well come forward with a planning application to seek to amend this parking layout and of course the Parish Council will be consulted if such an application is made.

I trust this confirms the position for you.
