





About the latest performance

This quarter again shows an improvement in the timeliness of adoption and is in line with the Adoption Reform Agenda. The vast majority of Lincolnshire children continue to be placed quickly and this is conformed by current year performance. The adoption services rigorous and creative family finding activity, supported by robust twin tracking processes, ensures that children are placed with their adoptive families at the earliest opportunity. Lincolnshire's performance against this indicator remains strong compared with the national threshold. Lower is better.






