Making safeguarding personal

Care Act 2014 – Safeguarding Adults Boards

- Publish a strategic plan for each financial year
- Publish an annual plan reporting on progress
- Conduct safeguarding adults reviews in accordance with Sec 44 of the Act

What is safeguarding?

- Protecting an adult's right to live in safety, free from abuse and neglect
- Organisations working together to prevent abuse and neglect
- Promotion of wellbeing
- Having regard to a persons wishes and feelings
- Making safeguarding personal



What is safeguarding?



- Complex , interpersonal relationships
- Care and support needs
- At risk of or experiencing abuse or neglect
- Unable to protect themselves against abuse or neglect

Team Around the Adult

- TAA is a central element of the existing LSAB Prevention Strategy;
- It has a focus on people who may need help but do not meet Section 42 Safeguarding Enquiry thresholds and/or people who are not engaging with services
- It builds upon the work of District Councils and Vulnerable Adult Panels or similar

Team Around the Adult

- We want to expand the Prevention Strategy to cover the 4 Statutory Boards;
- We also want to develop the TAA initiative to also have a targeted approach to helping people at risk;
In particular Adults with Mental illness, drug and alcohol addiction and/or homelessness who are regularly presenting to statutory agencies;
- We are currently taking forward some analysis of people frequently presenting at Emergency Duty Team (EDT) and Mental Health Crisis Teams which will inform a business case for next step...
