Chairman to state:

Since the last meeting of the Council I have been busy carrying out civic engagements around the County and I would like to take this opportunity to thank my wife and Chairman's Lady, Julia, along with my Vice-Chairman, Councillor Eddie Strengiel, for their support during this time.

Some of the highlights include the County Council stand at this year's Lincolnshire Show, which received hundreds of visitors to view the many services we have to offer over the two days. During the show, it was my honour to present the Lincolnshire Good Citizen Award and meet the recipients, who volunteer much of their time to provide invaluable support to their communities, yet expect no tribute or reward for their efforts.

We have also been extremely honoured to welcome members of the Royal family to Lincolnshire, His Majesty The King, HRH The Duke of Gloucester and just earlier this week, HRH The Princess Royal.

My county service of dedication held last Sunday in Lincoln Cathedral was incredibly enjoyable and one Julia and I shall long remember. I would like to thank those members who attended and showed their support at the service.

Julia and I have attended three RAF civic receptions.

RAF Digby, which was so interesting as they have a World War 2 museum, they also spoke of the arrival of a satellite expansion of GCHQ, for which they will welcome 50% of applications from Lincolnshire for employment.

RAF Waddington impressed all their guests with a display from the Red Arrows, ask Julia to show you her photo. She surprised herself as it was so impromptu!

RAF Coningsby and a flypast by a Typhoon set off all the car alarms as it flew so low.

Our county's connections with the RAF continues to thrive.

I would like to mention that the UKRO Challenge 2023 Lincolnshire's Festival of Rescue is being held today and tomorrow in the Cathedral and Castle area of Lincoln as well as on the city's Brayford pool. If any members have an opportunity to pay them a visit I am sure they would be most welcome. Further details can be found near the pigeonholes in the Members' Lounge.

It is with a heavy heart that I have to report the death of Councillor Ray Wootten. Ray served the Grantham North Division and was elected to the county council in June 2009 and served as Chairman of the Council from May 2013 to May 2014.

He was Chairman of the Environment and Economy Scrutiny Committee from May 2021 to May 2022, vice-chairman of the Overview and Scrutiny Management Board from December 2017 to May 2021 and vice-chairman of the Children and Young People Scrutiny Committee from May 2015 to May 2017.

Councillor Wootten was also Chairman of South Lincolnshire Local Access Forum from July 2012 to May 2019.

He was one of the original members of the Lincolnshire Police and Crime Panel and was elected as the inaugural chairman of the panel, undertaking this role from 27 November 2012 until 6 June 2013. He was subsequently elected vice-chairman of the panel.

He was also a serving member of South Kesteven District Council.

With sadness I also have to report the death of former County Councillor Mike Williams.

Mr Williams was first elected to the County Council in June 2001 and represented the Grantham South electoral division, until May 2005, when he was elected to the Grantham East division. He chose not to stand at the election in 2009.

Rules of debate

The Chairman will state:

Except as set out in rules 13.5 and 13.9 below, councillors are only allowed to speak once during the debate. Therefore, the motion and any amendment(s) will proceed as one debate.

(i) <u>Rule 13.5 (When a Councillor may speak again)</u>

A Councillor who has spoken on a motion may not speak again whilst it is the subject of debate, except:

a) In exercise of a right of reply;

- b) On a point of order or information; and
- c) By way of personal explanation
- (ii) <u>Rule 13.9 (Right of reply)</u>
 - (a) The mover of a motion has a right to reply at the end of the debate on the motion, immediately before it is put to the vote.
 - (b) If an amendment is moved, the mover of the original motion has the right of reply at the close of the debate on the amendment, but may otherwise not speak on it; and
 - (c) The mover of the amendment has no right of reply to the debate on his or her amendment.

COUNCIL MEETINGS - RULES OF DEBATE

(i) Rule 13.5 (When a Councillor may speak again)

A councillor who has spoken on a motion may not speak again whilst it is the subject of debate, except:

- a) In exercise of a right of reply;
- b) On a point of order or information; and
- c) By way of personal explanation.

(ii) <u>Rule 13.9 (Right of Reply)</u>

- a) The mover of a motion has a right to reply at the end of the debate on the motion, immediately before it is put to the vote;
- b) If an amendment is moved, the mover of the original motion has the right of reply at the close of debate on the amendments, but may otherwise not speak on it; and
- c) The mover of the amendment has no right of reply to the debate on his or her amendment.

COUNCIL MEETINGS - INTERVENTION IN DEBATE

- 1. (a) <u>Points of Order</u> are just that. They must relate to the Council Procedure Rules or conduct of the meeting and generally will be drawing attention to a perceived breach, e.g.
 - (i) absence of a quorum;
 - (ii) order of speeches;
 - (iii) irrelevance;
 - (iv) time limit for speech exceeded;
 - (v) misconduct;
 - (vi) motion not seconded.
 - (b) Examples of common intervention which are **NOT** points of order:-
 - (i) Points of information or Personal Explanation
 - (as to which see below);
 - (ii) Disagreement with a speaker;
 - (iii) Further thoughts or clarification of a previous speech prompted by the speaker (unless amounting to a Personal Explanation);
 - (iv) Correction of a speakers <u>opinion</u> (rather than fact, which is a Point of Information);
 - (v) An attempt to "reply" to another Member's speech or a point made in it;

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- 2. (a) <u>Point of Information</u> when <u>a Member</u> is speaking and is obviously proceeding on the basis of information which is wrong or of which the member is ignorant, <u>another</u> <u>member may</u> properly <u>seek to intervene to provide the correct or missing information</u>, thereby saving the Council from being misled and saving its time.
 - (b) <u>ASKING FOR</u> information is <u>NOT</u> a Point of Information; a member who has spoken may be able to request a colleague who has not yet spoken to ask;
- 3. (a) <u>A Personal Explanation</u> is a proper intervention only when an earlier speech by the Member is being misquoted or misrepresented;
 - (b) It must <u>not</u> be used as a spurious pretext for reiteration of the Member's earlier speech or as a second speech.
- 4. <u>Practice</u>

<u>Members making one of the Points must specify which one is being used. The Member speaking should give way. The Point should be made briefly. The Chairman will then rule on it promptly, firmly and finally. There will be no debate nor will the ruling of the Chairman be open to discussion.</u>
