Subject:	Care Quality Commission (CQC) feedback on Provider Collaboration during the Pandemic

Summary:

This report is to update the Health and Wellbeing Board on a review of collaborative working during COVID-19 undertaken by the Care Quality Commission.

1. Background

The Care Quality Commission (CQC) have undertaken a review of how providers have worked collaboratively during the response to COVID-19.

The CQC have reviewed arrangements in 11 systems, of which Lincolnshire is one. It is understood that the CQC will issue a national report drawing together all of its findings,

and that this report will be generic, and not involve describing findings within the specific systems they reviewed.

Nonetheless, the CQC have provided Lincolnshire with feedback, and a copy of the slides describing this is attached.

Headlines

This is a largely positive review – the CQC have said how impressed they were with everyone’s engagement, that they heard some very good information about how services in Lincolnshire had worked together and in support of each other in providing great care to people, and that there is much to be proud of across the health and care sector in Lincolnshire.

2. Conclusion

There is still a long way to go together through the next phase of Coronavirus and into the winter months (see agenda item 7c). Health and Care partners in Lincolnshire are committed to continuing to work in partnership, to picking up the points of learning, and to building on the excellent work described in the review.
