Changes to Winter Service Plan 2022 - Summary

Procedural Changes

Move to treated salt (brown salt) will be continued in 22/23 except for Manby where a mix of treated and non-treated salt will still be utilised as the last of the untreated salt is used. As this is used, it shall be replaced with full treated salt. Until this occurs, a higher salt spread as identified in Appendices E and F will be used until the mixed salt is used or there is a high confidence that the salt reacts as treated salt.

Move to the use of white diesel came into effect as of 1st April 2022 (Excise Notice 75). Therefore, all gritters are to use normal white diesel and pay duty on that fuel accordingly
